

ONE-DAY TRAINING & INTERACTION PROGRAM WITH EXPERTS FROM FINLAND UNIVERSITY ORGANISED FOR PRIMARY SCHOOL TEACHERS

•PUNJAB AIMS TO ACHIEVE WORLD-CLASS EDUCATION STANDARDS WITH INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION, SAYS HARJOT SINGH BAINS

Chandigarh, January 21:

Taking yet another firm step towards elevating the state's school education system to the world-class standards, Punjab School Education department, on Tuesday, organised a one-day training and interaction program with experts from the University of Turku, Finland. This session, held here at MGSIPA, has witnessed participation of 296 government primary school teachers, informed S. Harjot Singh Bains, Minister of School and Higher Education, Punjab.

Following the grand success of the visit of the first batch of 72 teachers who were sent for a three-week training program to Finland, S.
